1. RULES

- 1.1. The Regatta will be governed by the current rules, unless modified by these Sailing Instructions (SI), as defined in:
 - 1.1.1. The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) of World Sailing (WS);
 - 1.1.2. The Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing (AS);
 - 1.1.3. The IRC rules 2022 Parts A, B, C;
 - 1.1.4. ORC Rating System Rules;
 - 1.1.5. OMR Rating Rules where applicable.
- 1.2. The *International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea 1972* (COLREGS) shall apply at all times. RRS will apply only between those boats that are participating in the event, for the duration of the event. Should interaction occur with non-participating vessels, then COLREGS shall apply to all ships and shall over-ride all other rules.
- 1.3. All boats shall ensure their current rating certificate number/s (IRC, ORC, OMR) are loaded in their entry under “Event Ratings” by 1200hrs on Sunday 1st January 2023.
- 1.4. Boats not racing in an IRC Class (that allows variable and/or movable ballast) shall request permission from the Race Committee to use movable and/or variable ballast for the purpose of increasing stability. Any such request must be accompanied by full details of the system involved, and any such system will be taken into account in establishing the boat’s handicap. Stored power may be used for the operation of movable ballast systems. RRS 51 and 52 is modified to the extent required by this paragraph.
- 1.5. RRS 52 is changed to permit powered winches.
- 1.6. Boats entered in the Non-Spinnaker Class shall not carry spinnakers or Code Zero sails but may use a spinnaker pole to pole out one headsail. Headsails shall be fully hanked or attached to the main forestay by the means of a luff groove device.
- 1.7. Between sunset and sunrise, when a boat cannot determine with certainty what tack **the** other boat is on, she shall keep clear of that boat. Competitors are reminded that part of the definition of “room”, includes taking into account the existing conditions (including visibility).
- 1.8. The owner and skipper of all boats shall ensure that no entities form unauthorised associations between themselves (and their products or services) and the event (otherwise known as ambush marketing”) or any “hijack signage” is carried out by or on behalf of themselves or their sponsors with reference to the event and that nothing else is done which might undermine the event, the rights of the event sponsor, or any other sponsor or participant in the event.
- 1.9. Before the first race of the Regatta, all boats in IRC Division shall submit to the Sailing Office a declaration of all the sails carried on board for the duration of the Regatta (IRC Rule 21.1.5(d) and a crew declaration.
- 1.10. Boats shall not use boat tracking, photography, or video for commercial purposes without prior written approval of the organising authority.
- 1.11. When conflict occurs between the Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions, the rules of the Sailing Instructions shall prevail. This changes RRS 63.7.
- 1.12. RRS Appendix T Arbitration will apply.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

The Official Notice Board will be the online Notice Board located on the event website <https://www.sailparadise.com.au/notice-board/>. Additionally, a physical display shall be located in the “Focsile” room at Southport Yacht Club, Main Beach.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the Quarterdeck of Southport Yacht Club, Main Beach.
- 4.2 When a signal is displayed over a divisional flag, it shall apply to that division only.
- 4.3 Code Flag “AP” (Answering Pennant), displayed with two sounds (one sound when lowered) means, “The race is postponed. The Warning Signal will be made not less than 60 minutes after this signal is lowered”. (This changes RRS Race Signals “AP”).

5. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- 5.1 The Race Committee may make changes to this schedule at any time. The number of races for each day will be advised at the Skippers Briefing each day which will be dependent on weather conditions.

6. DIVISION FLAGS

Boats shall fly their provided Division Flag from the backstay or conspicuously from the stern for boats without a backstay.

7. RACING AREA

Attachment “A” shows the location of the racing area.

- 7.1 Round the Cans racing area will be in the ocean waters off Main Beach.
- 7.2 Passage races will be in the ocean waters between Gold Coast Seaway and Point Danger.

8. THE COURSES

- 8.1 The diagrams in attachment “B” show the courses, including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 8.2 The starting area will be advised at the Skipper’s Briefing and will be on the ocean waters between the Gold Coast Sand Pumping Jetty and Surfers Paradise.
- 8.3 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal vessel will display the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.
- 8.4 Should a mark of a “Passage Course” be missing or not be located within 0.1 nautical mile of its co-ordinates, competitors shall round or pass at the co-ordinates of the mark. This alters RRS 34.
- 8.5 GPS Datum is set to WGS84.

9. MARKS

Marks are described in “Attachment ‘B’”

10. AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

The following areas are designated as obstructions:

- 10.1 The start and finish lines are obstructions unless starting or finishing a race.
- 10.2 All Shark nets are to be passed to seaward and are designated obstructions.
- 10.3 For the purposes of RRS 19 & 20, “Wonder Reef” – the Gold Coast dive attraction which is located 2.5 km east of Main Beach at approximately 27° 57.70’ S, 153° 27.30’ E is a continuing obstruction and a prohibited area. This area is defined with four (4) yellow special marker buoys. Should any of the four (4) yellow special marker buoys be missing, a boat is still not permitted into this prohibited area.

11. THE START

- 11.1 The divisional order of starting will be posted on the Notice Board by 0800hrs each day.
- 11.2 Races will be started by using RRS 26 with the warning signal made 5 minutes before the starting signal.

- 11.3 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal vessel at the starboard end and a port end start mark.
- 11.4 When more than one race is to be sailed on one day, international Pennant “AP” may be flown on the race committee signal Vessel between races.

Note: For all on-water starts, an inner limit buoy may be laid near the race committee signal vessel approximately on the starting line. Boats shall not pass between this buoy and the race committee signal vessel at any time. A breach of this SI is open to protest by the race committee only. This alters RRS 60.1 and 60.3.

12. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position in accordance with RRS 33.

13. THE FINISH

- 13.1 The finishing mark for Passage Races will be laid inshore of the race committee signal vessel.
- 13.2 The finish line will be between the signal mast displaying a Blue flag on the race committee signal vessel at the starboard end and the port end finish mark.
- 13.3 The race committee may shorten course at any part of the course. Boats shall finish between the race committee signal vessel displaying Code Flag “S” and a prominent feature of their choice (which may include any laid mark).
- 13.4 An alternate Finish line for a passage race may be between the end of the Sand Pumping Jetty and a laid Finish Mark to Starboard. This shall be notified at Skippers Briefing.

14. PENALTIES

- 14.1 Alternative Penalties - For windward/leeward courses the two-turns penalty (RRS 44.1) is changed to a one turn penalty, except for infringements that occur within the zone.
- 14.2 Event Nominated Penalties shall be a 20% scoring penalty. This will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a). The scoring abbreviation for an Event Nominated Penalty under this instruction will be ENP. The penalty shall be applied to the race sailed nearest, in time to that of the breach. This changes RRS Rule 60, 60.2, A4 and A5.

15. TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

COURSE	TARGET TIME	TIME LIMIT

- 15.1 A boat still racing when her time limit expires will be scored points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus 25% of the number of starters in her division, rounded to the nearest whole number, but no more points than the number of starters. Such boats will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE). This changes RRS 35, A4.2 and A5. Prior to the time limit expiring, the Race Committee shall record the score of TLE to boats still racing that will not make the time limit. This changes rule 28.1, 35, A4.2 and A5.

16. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 16.1 Boats intending to protest shall inform the Race Committee immediately after finishing the race via VHF09 and advising of their intention to protest. This changes RRS 61 and is in addition to the requirements of RRS 61.1.

- 16.2 Protest forms are available at SYC Reception, Main Beach. Protests shall be delivered there within the Protest Time Limit.
- 16.3 The protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 16.4 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, beginning at the time posted.
- 16.5 Breaches of SIs 1.11, 15, 17.6, 18, 27 and 29 not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 16.6 RRS 66 is changed by adding: "On the last day of racing, a party to the hearing may ask for a reopening no later than 20 minutes after being informed of the decision. If the party was informed of the decision on the previous day, it shall ask for a reopening no later than the time limit for protests."

17. SCORING AND HANDICAPS

- 17.1 The scoring system shall be the Low Point System, RRS Appendix A.
- 17.2 Two races must be completed to constitute a series
- 17.3 When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of all her race scores.
- 17.4 When 6 to 8 races have been completed, a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 17.5 The Scoring / Handicap system in each Division is as follows:

- 17.6 The starting Performance Based Handicap Time Correction Factor (TCF) for each yacht will be determined by the Southport Yacht Club Handicap Committee. The decision of the Handicap Committee or the representative on any handicap matter will be final and will not be grounds for requests for redress. This alters RRS 60.1 (b).

18. SAFETY

- 18.1 All helmspersons shall "Log On" with Gold Coast Seaway Tower on VHF73 providing Boat Name and Persons on Board (POB) **prior** to departing the Gold Coast Seaway.
- 18.2 All helmspersons shall "Sign On" with Race Control, by responding to the "Intention to Race SMS", declaring their Intention to Race and Person's on Board (POB) on each day of racing. This will be sent to the main and alternate mobile contact as identified at registration.
- 18.3 A boat that retires from a race shall notify Race Control as soon as possible. This must be via VHF09 if Race Control is still On Station **or** by texting the Principal Race Officer advising their exact location and their intentions of travel.
- 18.4 All helmspersons shall "Log Off" with Gold Coast Seaway Tower on VHF73 immediately upon safely returning through the Gold Coast Seaway.

- 18.5 Failure to comply with any of these Safety Regulations shall result in an Event Nominated Penalty (ENP).

19. REPLACEMENT OF EQUIPMENT

Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the race committee / protest committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

20. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

On the water, a boat can be instructed by a member of the race committee or the technical committee to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection. Ashore, equipment may be inspected or measured after racing.

21. EVENT ADVERTISING

Boats shall display event advertising as supplied & instructed by the organising authority.

22. OFFICIAL BOATS

Race Committee Vessels will display the SYC burgee.

23. SUPPORT BOATS

Support vessels shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first division to start until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

24. TRASH DISPOSAL

RRS 47 applies.

25. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

All boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

26. RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 26.1. All on water race communications will be made via VHF09.
- 26.2. The race committee may broadcast the course to be sailed, names/sail number of recalled boats, and/or other information of interest to competitors on VHF09 channel. Any such communications by the race committee will not be considered as outside help, this alters RRS 41. The race committee may also transmit other information by Short Message Service (SMS).
- 26.3. Any failure of, or defect in, any such a broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This alters RRS 60.1 and 62.
- 26.4. A boat shall carry a tracking device if so required by the OA. The device will be supplied by the OA.

27. PRIZES

- 27.1 Divisional Daily prizes will be awarded for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd on corrected time in each race, except if there are multiple races held for a division, the day's total combined race scores will determine the winners.

- 27.2 At the conclusion of the Regatta, trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd for each division's Scoring / Handicaps based on their overall points score.
- 27.3 The Gold Coast IRC Champion perpetual trophy will be awarded to the overall series winner of the IRC scoring results for the IRC Division.
- 27.4 The Michael Daly Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the overall PHS winner in the Monohull Performance Racing Division 1.
- 27.5 The Sail Paradise Series perpetual trophy will be awarded to the overall ORCc series winner for the Monohull Performance Racing Division 1.
- 27.6 The SYC Sail Paradise Series Winning Club Champion perpetual trophy will be awarded to the best overall performance of an SYC boat in any division.
- 27.7 The Sail Paradise Overall Champion perpetual trophy shall be awarded to the best performing overall boat, i.e. any divisional 1st place boat with the largest winning margin.
- 27.8 Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

28. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 28.1 All those taking part in these races do so at their own risk and responsibility. Neither Southport Yacht Club nor any club or company connected with the organising of these races is responsible for the seaworthiness of a boat whose entry is accepted, nor for the sufficiency or adequacy of its equipment. Owners shall accept full responsibility for the seaworthiness and safe navigation of their boats and competence of their crews.
- 28.2 Boat owners, skippers and crew should be aware that there may be uncharted obstacles under the waters on which races are held. Such uncharted obstacles include reefs, bomboras and rocks which could be a danger to boats and crews. Southport Yacht Club inc. accepts no responsibility for any damage to or loss of any boat or for injury to, or death of, any crew person which may occur as a result of a collision with any underwater obstacle. All boats compete in races at their own risk.
- 28.3 Each participating yacht shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000.00 per incident or the equivalent, which also includes coverage for racing in the Regatta.

Proof of Insurance may be required, clearly indicating the person, the amount and the period of coverage, at registration. All owners/competitors who complete an Entry are deemed to have made this declaration that they hold such coverage.

29. RISK STATEMENT

By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes. The Organising Authority and Australian Sailing will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

WINDWARD / LEEWARD COURSES

- A 1 The following course descriptions lists the order in which marks are to be passed and the side each mark is to be rounded.
- A 2 The course to be sailed for each class will be signalled by the Course number being displayed on the race committee signal vessel. The course to be sailed may also be broadcast on VHF09.
- A 3 A board displaying the approximate compass bearing from the race committee signal vessel to Mark 1 and to Mark 1a will be displayed from the race committee signal vessel.
- A 4 Mark 1 and Mark 1a will be laid to windward of the starting line.

The Gate will be laid approximately 0.05 nm to windward of the starting line.

NOTE: The Gate may be laid after the starting signal.

- A 5 All Marks to PORT except the Gate. Either Gate marks may be rounded to Port or to Starboard after passing through the gate from the direction of the last mark.

NOTE. If only one Gate mark is set, yachts shall round that mark to port.

- A 6 For a change of course direction or length of one leg the Race Committee will move the original mark (or marks or finishing line) or will lay a new mark (or marks) identical to the original at the new position. Any subsequent marks may be relocated to maintain the original course configuration. Changes will be signalled in accordance with RRS 33.
- A.7 Mark 2 will not be laid if not required.

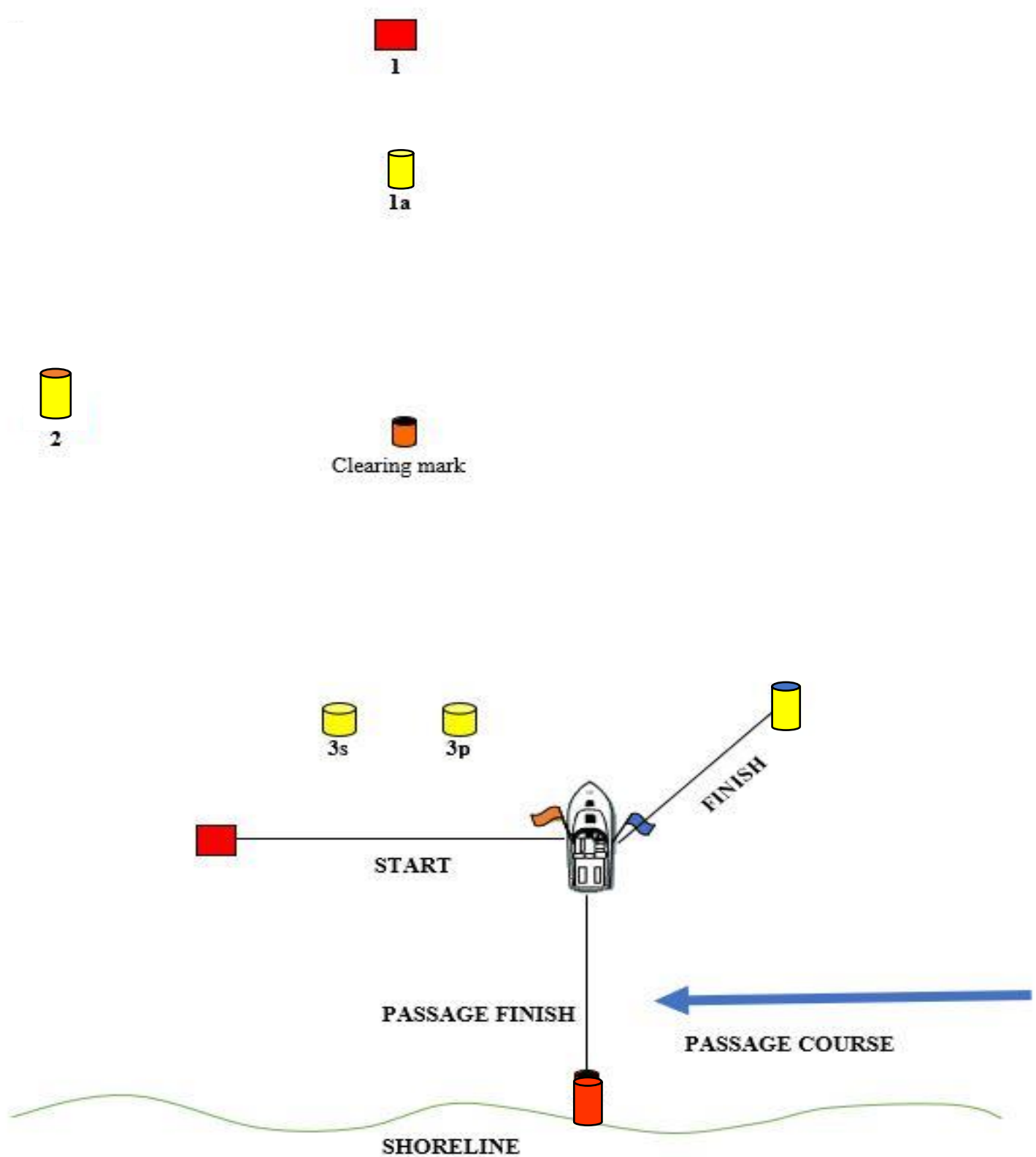
